# FORUM BUSINESS MEETING 1993

The Forum for History of Human Science held its annual business meeting November 12, 1993, at the History of Science Society convention in Santa Fe. About twenty people attended.

In the absence of Chair Mitchell Ash, who was in Europe, Treasurer David Valone presided. He reported that the Forum is still in good financial shape, despite unexpected expenses for the Newsletter. Because Corresponding Secretary Richard von Mayrhauser is on leave from Slippery Rock, he was unable to have his department cover the expenses of the Fall Newsletter, which came to about \$100. This still

left the Forum with over \$1200, and the members voted not to seek additional dues.

Elections were held for new members of the Steering Committee. David Valone was reelected Treasurer by acclamation. Richard von Mayrhauser was reelected Corresponding Secretary pending confirmation of his willingness to serve another term [later confirmed!]. Ellen Herman was elected Representative to replace outgoing Representative Leila Zenderland.
